

Work Package n°2 – Conceptual framework and Co-Created Training Scheme for covering mental health needs of migrants and refugees

SUMMARY OF TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES REVIEWS

Countries: Germany, Spain, Cyprus, Italy, Greece

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Introduction

The EU MiCare project's purpose is to develop a comprehensive training program for health professionals working with migrants and refugees throughout the migration process. The EU Mi-Care consortium conducted a focused literature review on migrant and refugee mental health needs in their country and learned more about current training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives on mental health issues. Through a participatory process, Work Package 2 hopes to create a conceptual framework outlining specific training needs and perspectives of professionals through FGDs, a mapping of the current context with regards to mental health and migration in each partner country (including facilitators and barriers to mental healthcare, stakeholders, etc.), accompanied with training activities that currently exist for health professionals concerning mental healthcare of migrants and refugees. This report supplements the tool, Research Grid of Training Opportunities, outlining available and relevant training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives on mental health issues in partner countries: Spain, Germany, Greece, Cyprus, and Italy.

The following classification of training opportunities was applied in the tool:

Formal: delivered by public and private educational institutions (universities, training centers, etc.) providing an official certification/qualification.

Non-formal: delivered by NGOs and third parties that are involved in migration health care and provide official certification for professional training (ECM accreditation).

Informal: provided by NGOs and third parties, without providing official certification.

Spain

This executive summary described the main results of mapping available relevant training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives in mental health in Spain.

In Spain, there are currently at least 16 training opportunities; seven formal and nine informal training courses. Five continuing education courses were found, two at postgraduate level and the rest unspecified. In different modalities; online, offline, face-to-face, and mixed.

The thematic areas covered include:

- Mental health care
- Mental health, gender, and interventions
- Psychosocial support
- Interculturality
- Mental health in childhood and adolescence
- Migrants and Refugee intervention

The organizations providing the training courses include:

- NGO
- Non-profit associations
- Universities
- Research and intervention institutes
- International federations

The target groups for the courses include:

- Educators
- Mental health professionals
- Professionals working with vulnerable groups of children and adolescents
- Undergraduate and postgraduate students in health science
- Undergraduate and postgraduate students in social sciences
- Intercultural mediators
- Social researchers
- Members of social organizations
- Volunteers

Only registration or degree requirements will be found for most of the courses. The duration varies from a minimum of 5 hours to 500 hours depending on the certification and ETCS credits.

There are degrees that only certify participation in the training program and degrees that qualify professionals for professional practice through postgraduate degrees.

Germany

An extensive mapping review covering the years from 2014 to 2023 has been conducted to identify the available training opportunities in Germany. These training opportunities include the review of validation-certification opportunities in Germany.

With the present collection of already existing training opportunities, we aim to help identify gaps and limitations as well as good practices in order to produce an innovative training curriculum that will go a step forward from the already existing ones.

Information for the German training opportunities grid was collected from public and private educational institutions, mental health centers offering training programs to mental health professionals, vocational education and training centers, universities etc.

Main Findings

Most of the trainings identified include:

- Great variety of training opportunities (47)
- Majority is formal (37/47 formal)
- short-term trainings (few hours to 1 weekend)
- Almost exclusively short trainings are organised by NGOs, mental health centers etc.
- Almost no academic courses dealing with the topic (very few found after very intense research)
- Almost always first a theoretical part opens the training, but sources of this information are rarely mentioned
- Practical parts contain mainly case studies (interactive exercises are rare)

Main topics include:

- Refugees in need of special protection
- LGBTIQ+ refugees
- Sleep disorder in refugees
- Refugee children
- Trauma
- Suicide
- Self-care Addressed target groups
- Mental health professionals (therapists, psychologists etc.)
- Actors in refugee work (social workers, teachers etc.)
- Employees in authorities and public institutions

- Volunteers

Preliminary Findings (potential gaps)

- No complete training with different modules as the one EU-MiCare wants to offer exists
- Few trainings are for free which potentially prohibits many participants from working for smaller organisations, for volunteers etc.
- No attention on this topic is present university courses - our training could be integrated in the curricula of relevant university modules
- Topics of transcultural competences and/or therapy with an interpreter not highlighted
- Important to prepare a more interactive training instead of “theory-only” input
- Promote the EU-MiCare Training to be as one that comes in modules and is a complete package
- Make mental health for refugees and migrants a necessary course module during the (vocational) education of health professionals.
- Make it an accredited training in each countries state chambers of physical and psychological therapists. Doctors should also be able to get points after completing the training at the medical council.

Greece

A mapping review was carried out to identify past and available relevant training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives on migrants' & refugees' mental health issues in Greece.

Main Findings

The Greek context presents a variety of trainings, especially formal, in which the mental health of migrants and refugees represents at least one of the thematic focuses. Some challenges detected are:

- Training courses are scheduled based on demand and when there are enough participants.
- The continuation of some training depends on the provision of funding.
- Organizations do not send their staff to trainings due to workload and shortage of staff.
- Among the specific mental health issues most addressed/represented are intentional violence, trauma, and the needs of migrant and refugee children.
- The range of training target groups is very broad including psychologists, Health professionals, educators, cultural mediators, interpreters, and professionals working in NGOs.

Cyprus

The Cypriot team encountered difficulties as not many programmes exist on education for migrants and refugees' mental health, further highlighting the importance of this mapping review. Specifically, the content and training material of each identified relevant program is to be reviewed to identify gaps and limitations that can be addressed when developing a new training program. The time frame of these trainings spans from 2015-2022

Main findings (potential gaps and limitations):

- Quantity of training opportunities to mental health professionals is small.
- Most of the training opportunities are addressed to the migrants and refugees, with concern to the language and technical skills.
- There is a lack of formal training opportunities (universities etc.)
- Most of the training opportunities are non-formal and informal. Seminars that are mostly addressed to social workers are taking place in Cyprus. Inconsistency and short-term seminars, though, is the norm of these opportunities as they are on a voluntary basis.
- Cultural mediators are not systematically present in psychotherapeutic services, nor they are systematically present at migrant centers. If available, migrants with a knowledge of Greek or English provide interpretation services for other migrants and mental health providers. Also, if mental health providers request an interpreter, the migrant center, upon availability, can offer an unofficial interpreter.
- In principle, refugees are entitled to psychotherapeutic treatment, but a lot of times they don't receive any services, or the services may have a long waiting list.
- There is no specialization of mental health professionals to migrants and refugees' mental health.

Italy

An extensive mapping review was carried out to identify past and available relevant training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives on migrants' & refugees' mental health issues in Italy from January 2015 to February 2023. At the same time, related validation-certification opportunities were highlighted.

Main Findings:

The Italian context presents a relatively rich variety of professional training offerings, especially non-formal, in which the mental health of migrants and refugees constitutes at least one of the thematic focuses, if not the main topic. Most of these programmes are offered free of charge, on a voluntary basis, as short-term (average 2-3 days) continuing vocational training. The main gaps detected are:

- Lack of structured implementation at the national level, despite the presence of government directives and guidelines in this regard and the initiative of a few organisations in trying to build a professional network.
- Lack of comprehensiveness and completeness, as most programmes either offer just a general introduction to mental health care needs, as a supplementary element of a broader healthcare curriculum; or focus only on specific/particular mental health topics within a short training.
- Lack of continuity and systematicity as the programmes mostly arise 'spontaneously', on a voluntary basis, and do not repeat on a stable or regular basis (not even in the academic field), and in some cases only cover interventions in certain regional areas.

Other relevant notes:

- Over 40 offerings in the last 8 years. It is difficult to determine an exact number as some training offers are realised by NGOs either on direct request (and not all archives are directly accessible) or within broader training actions at the European level. (For a detailed overview see the document 'Research_Grid_Italy')
- Among the specific mental health issues most addressed/represented are intentional violence, trauma, and the needs of migrant and refugee children.
- An emerging awareness of sexual and gender-based violence is noted, but a focus on the specific needs of LGBTIQ people is totally absent.
- An emerging focus on the multidisciplinary approach to the health of migrants and refugees, as well as ethnopsychology and the transcultural perspective, is noted.
- Overall, the range of training target groups is very broad, from psychologists to nurses, to cultural mediators, to regional counselors.

- Although most of the courses are non-formal, thus still officially accredited as vocational training, there is very little academic training on offer.

Conclusion

This report, accompanied by the Research Grid of Training Opportunities, outlines the current state of available training opportunities and evidence-based initiatives focusing on the mental health of migrants and refugees. Each country's findings highlight the strengths and gaps in the existing training landscape, emphasizing the need for innovative, holistic, and a comprehensive training approach that will address the often neglected mental health needs of this vulnerable population effectively.

Germany's mapping review revealed a myriad of training opportunities, predominantly formal; however, gaps were identified with regards to transcultural competencies and interpreters. In Greece, although the review uncovered diverse training programs focusing on the mental health of migrants and refugees, the continuation of these programs are dependent on funding and organizations face challenges in sending staff due to workload and staff shortages. Meanwhile, Cyprus encountered difficulties in finding training opportunities for professionals that target migrant and refugee mental health. Italy provides a rich variety of professional training opportunities; however, a multi-disciplinary approach is not undertaken and a need for further attention to LGBTIQ+ individuals' needs was observed.

The EU Mi-Care project is determined to facilitate bridging the gaps and limitations of current training opportunities in Cyprus, Italy, Spain, Germany, and Greece, providing a complete and extensive training curriculum that can be integrated into a variety of different settings. By targeting mental health professionals, interpreters, social workers, educators, and all professionals who come into regular contact with refugee and migrant communities, the EU Mi-Care training can play a pivotal role in enhancing and promoting mental healthcare for migrants and refugees across Europe.
